Estimated Cost: \$1200-\$1500 (includes transportation, most food, lodging, entrance fees to sites).

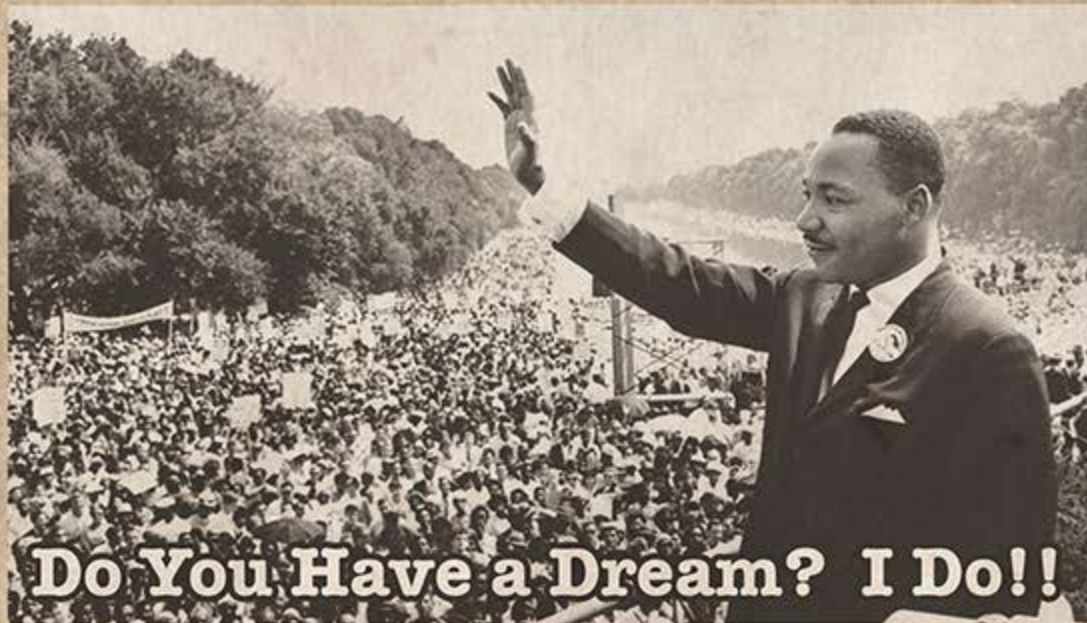
